## Quiz Answers

1. Dolly the Sheep became the first successfully cloned mammal. When was Dolly born?

Dolly was a Finn-Dorset Sheep born on 5<sup>th</sup> **July 1996** at the Roslin Institute. She was the first mammal to be cloned from an adult somatic cell. Dolly died aged 6 on 14<sup>th</sup> February 2003

2. What was the name of the killer whale at the centre of the Seaworld controversy and featured in a documentary Blackfish?

**Tilikum** was a male Orca captured in Iceland in 1983. Tilikum was featured in a 2013 documentary, Blackfish. He was involved in 3 fatal attacks.

3. Which of these is another name for the medical condition Hypertrichosis?

Hypertrichosis or Werewolf Syndrome causes excessive hair growth anywhere on a person's body. It can affect both sexes but is extremely rare.

4. What is the Latin name for the above species (Chimpanzee)

The latin name for the Chimpanzee is **Pan troglodytes**

5. According to the Rare Breeds Survival Trust, how many native UK breeds of Pig are there?

The UK has **11** native pig breeds, all are considered rare and at risk of extinction.

6. How many hearts does an octopus have?

Octopuses have **three** hearts. Their two peripheral hearts pump blood through the gills, where it picks up oxygen. A central heart then circulates the oxygenated blood to the rest of the body to provide energy for organs and muscles.

7. What is a rhino's horn made out of?

Rhino horn is made up of **keratin** - the same protein which forms the basis of our hair and nails.

8. Where on a Horse would you find the Fetlock?

Fetlock is a term used for the joint in the **lower leg** where the cannon bone, the proximal sesamoid bones, and the first phalanx (long pastern bone) meet.

9. According to the IUCN, what percentage of the estimated 44000 species threatened with extinction are Birds

**12%** of the estimated 44000 species in the IUCN threatened with extinction list are Birds

10. Above is the common Jay. To which family of Birds does the Jay belong?
